"And the Word became flesh and lived among us..."

During Advent, we spoke about and anticipated the comings of Jesus in the past, the present, and the future. At Christmas we celebrate the birth of Jesus, the baby in a manger whose arrival signified the salvation of the world. During the season of Epiphany, following Christmas, we realize Jesus is living in, with, and among us and reveals himself to us and to the world frequently.

The word "epiphany" has become part of the vernacular, or common language, to point toward a sudden realization of something important. It is often indicated in cartoons when a bright light bulb appears over a character's head, implying they have a big idea. Oprah Winfrey often talks about epiphanies; she refers to them as "Ah-ha" moments, those times you finally understand what is happening and why it is significant.

Light is often associated with Epiphany. Epiphany is not about the arrival of something new or a new beginning of something different. The light allows us to see what was already there, what has always been there, but what the darkness hid from us. The light reveals what we hadn't seen, what we hadn't known, what escaped our awareness.

The longest night, the winter solstice, the peak darkness of the year is now behind us. The days will be getting gradually longer over the next six months and we will have more and more light from the sun in our lives. What may have been hidden in the dark will be revealed in the light of this season.

The Word is living among us, in Hot Springs Village. I pray the light of these weeks of Epiphany reveals the presence of Jesus here to all of us. May the light of Christ shine both on us and from us as a beacon of life, love, and hope for the world.

The purchase of 3 children's coats, 3 individuals were put in treatment with the items they needed, a single lady housed in a camper, 4 individuals treated at Levi Hospital, space heaters for 2 elderly individuals, food and straw for twenty-one dogs, as well as 2 dog houses, a bike for a young man for transportation to his job, shoes for a young man, 150 bus passes to get people back and forth to work and doctors appointments, blankets for 14, food for 5 families, water and rental assistance for 3 families, help for 3 individuals to get ID's so they could get jobs, clothing for 4 people to help them retain jobs, meals for 250 people.

Please remember, these donations come from you, and you help SO many people every day. You are boldly serving God with your gracious, kind generosity.
