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Shoe Box Golf Scramble

Last summer, our Shoe Box Golf Scramble raised \$586 to fund our mission to support the high school students at both Mountain Pine and Jessieville High Schools. Those of you that participated should be proud of your efforts no matter what type of golf game you have! The Missions Team elected to supplement the scramble proceeds so as to create a \$600 grant to each school.

In December, Dick Coulson, Shoe Box Scramble Coordinator, Anne King, Missions Team, and Vicar Julie Wesley presented a \$600 check to Paden Ault, Jessieville Student Council Vice President. Also in attendance were Susan Martin, Student Councilor and Michael Spraggins, High School Principal. Paden explained that the Student Council will meet and make a determination as to how the grant should be spent to most benefit all of the high school students.





Jerry Fager, Joy in Christ Council President and Dick Coulson, worked with Lillian Alderman, Student Councilor at Mountain Pine High School to present them with another check for \$600. Mountain Pine High School puts the grant money toward their "Hygiene Closet" where a student can find shoes, articles of clothing, food, school supplies, medical or hygiene supplies, anything they need, no questions asked. The only rule: Take only what you need and will use.

Authorities from both schools thanked Joy in Christ for the support we provide to their student population. Some of

these kids have limited resources and our Shoe Box Golf Scramble Grants help fill some of their needs.

As Scramble Coordinator, I thank all you golfers for supporting the program. You are doing God's work and having fun and fellowship while doing so. I look forward to seeing you out there on the links again this summer.

Reception of New Members


We are planning to receive new members into the congregation during worship

The Situation:

Multiple wildfires have broken out across Los Angeles County in California, with tens of thousands of people under evacuation orders. Sparked by dry conditions, strong winds and a limited water supply, these fires have destroyed homes and businesses and have led to injuries and loss of life. News is still unfolding about the full impact as firefighting efforts continue.
